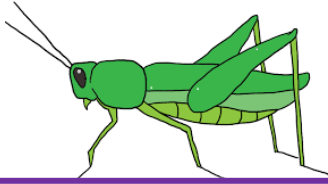

This week...

The very cold temperatures this week have helped us explore the season of winter. We have talked about how we need to dress for this season and some of the things we might see in this season like frost, ice, bare trees, snowdrops, and Robins – one of the very few birds that does not migrate in the winter. In math's we have been learning all about capacity. We have used the language of capacity like **full, empty, half full, nearly full, nearly empty** and have been measuring how much water different containers can hold. There has also been great excitement as we introduced toast into our snack area. The children have learnt how to be safe when using the toaster – where to stand how to remove the toast when it is finished. They have been buttering it themselves and washing up and drying their plates. They have absolutely LOVED it!
