This week...

Inspired by our drama 'It's not a stick..' the children have been writing about their ideas. We have learnt about what a sentence is - a group of words that make sense - and how it looks on a page. For a sentence, we always write one word after another, starting at the beginning of the line and each word going from left to write. We also learnt about finger spaces so that we can see each word clearly and then easy to read. It has been great to see the children apply their phonics learning in the spelling of words they want to use. In maths we have been talking about number bonds - 2 numbers that we **add together** to get the same total each time. By the end of Reception children need to know their number bonds to $\mathbf{5}$ (eg 1+4=5. 2+3=5) and some number bonds to $\mathbf{10}$ (e.g 1+9=10, 2+8=10). In phonics, we have now learnt all the phonemes we need for Reception. The next phase of phonemes will be learnt in Year 1. We will spend the rest of the summer term reviewina Phase 3 and practisina our readina

Phonics this week

Phonemes – *ure*, reviewing oa, oo (long)
Common exception words (tricky) – are
High frequency words (try to read on sight)
look, too
