## This week...

We have been learning more about non- fiction books and how we use these to find out real facts about a range of different things in the world. As we are now becoming experts in the lifecycle of a frog, we have decided to write our own non-fiction book - 'Frog facts'. The children are working in small groups to write an exciting fact using what they know about writing a sentence and using their phonics to so do. Many of the tadpoles have changed into froglets and we have already released some of them into the forest school pond to continue their lifecycle in their natural habitat. In maths we have been understanding the concept of doubling and how when we double an amount, we see 2 of the same. When we double a number we see it twice like in the number sentence like $2+2$ $=4$ is the same as double 4 .

## Next week

We will continue writing our fact books on frogs and hope to 'publish' it by the end of the week. We will be reading a story called Daisy and the sunflower and planting our own sunflowers. These are great plants for learning all about how seeds germinate and grow. We will extend our learning about lifecycles to the sunflower lifecycle. We will be using timelines to find out when things happened in the past and children will have an opportunity to make their own timeline of their past.
