What a busy and exiting week we have had in Reception!
On Tuesday we enjoyed a visit from the Mini Moster Roadshow. The children loved meeting a range of unusual insect and reptiles and learning all about them. Many children were even feeling brave enough to touch and hold some of the creatures! A huge thank you to the Friends Committee who very kindly funded this visit.
On Thursday we celebrated World Book Day. Throughout the day we read a variety of books that explored the theme of diversity. We loved seeing all the children in the special costumes too!
This week we have been using new resources in the creative area.
The children have learnt how to paint independently, including collecting the resources they need and clearing up after themselves.
They have particularly enjoyed exploring colour mixing to create a range of new shades and colours.

In maths we have been exploring number bonds (pairs of numbers that make 10) and have been comparing numbers with the help of Charlie Crocodile, who only likes to eat the biggest numbers!
