### This week

We started our week learning about St Patricks Day Celebrations and the traditions associated with the day. The children have been busy colouring shamrocks and creating Irish flags.

In maths we have moved onto to look at 3D shapes (cube, cuboid, pyramid, cone, sphere, cylinder) and the vocabulary we use to describe their properties (vertices, edges and faces). The children have been trying to identify some of these shapes in the environment too! It was also great to see those parents that were able to attend the Maths Café's this week. The children really love it when their grown-ups in them in school.

In literacy we have been recapping what makes a good sentence and have tried to write our own sentences. We need to remember to include a capital letter at the start, finger spaces between words, that we start on the left-hand side of the page and finishing with a full stop. Applying our phonics skills is very important too! The children also chose to carry on with science investigations this week, exploring shadows with a little help from the sun!

#### **Phonics**

Please keep on practising the sounds that have been sent home in the phonics folders, even if they seem to already know most of them. Don't forget to practise Common Exception Words too — attached to reading record. Please add any writing the children do at home to their tapestry!

#### Next week:

Next week is a short but busy week! We will be learning about the Christian celebration of Easter and enjoying an Easter Hunt!
