£500	£453	£47	Replace and replenish Equipment	Old and weathered equipment has been repaired or replaced with new equipment. This has meant that children are able to access safe, sport specific equipment and that there is enough equipment for all children to in the class.

Children have had opportunities to plant, dig, grow etc. This has supported their understanding of the natural world, where their food comes from and has helped to develop greater gross and fine motor control.

This has also helped support good 'Social Emotional Mental Health' with the children.

Children have access to a selection of sensory objects within the classroom. This has helped many of the children, especially those who exhibit anxiety and find emotional regulation a challenge.

This has been evidenced via the achievement of the WNDSSP Platinum Sporting Stars Award.

£100	£0	£100	Staff PE kit	We didn't need to replace any staff PE kit this year. Staff wearing kit ensures all look professional, smart and are visible during PE lessons/Outdoor playtimes. This helps to create a professional atmosphere. All staff wear kits during PE lessons, demonstrating to children to importance of wearing appropriate clothing to keep us safe and allow us to participate fully in the lesson.

Sun hats have meant that all children can play outside when it is sunny.

The area is currently being developed to ensure it is ready for the arrival of Chickens. This will further extend children's range of learning opportunities when at Forest School.
£200	£200	£0	Staff CPD	Staff have had online Dance CPD to support the delivery of REAL Dance. Staff member has also been on a PE refresher course.

They have also supported in YR within CP and learning times to ensure all children can fully access all areas of the curriculum as fully as possible.
